William Tell, legendary Swiss national hero. A native of Uri, Tell refused to pay homage to the Austrian Gessler, who forced him as punishment to shoot an apple from his son's head. Tell succeeded and then escaped, later ambushing and slaying Gessler, thus supplying the spark that drove out Austrian overlords and caused formation of League of Uri, Schwyz and Unterwalden.
