

He attended the Edinburgh Academy, Edinburgh & St. Andrews Universities and the Corpus Christi College in Oxford.

His career consisted of the following positions:

Advocate Scotch Bar – 1870

Sheriff of Charcery – 1885-88

Procurator for the Church of Scotland – 1886-90

Sheriff of Renfrew and Bute – 1888

Sheriff of Perthshire – 1889

Solicitor-General for Scotland 1890

M.P. (C.) Edinburgh and Andrews Universities – 1890-96

Lord Advocate of Scotland – 1891-2; 1895-6



At the last meeting of the Grand Camp, held in October 25/25, Major H. V. Randolph, Chairman of the Legis made his report as follows:


Your Committee on Legislation beg leave to make the recommendations for your consideration:
