Заемъ сей внесенъ въ Государственную Долговую Книгу подъ названіемъ "Государственный внутренний четырехъ съ половиной процентный выигрышный заемъ 1917 года".

Билеты сего займа выпускаются аменные и на предъявителя, достоинствомъ въ 200 рублей нарицательныхъ.

Владѣлецъ настоящаго билета участвовать въ займѣ суммою въ 200 рублей, приносящей четыре съ половиной процента въ годъ до погашенія билета напимомъ на него выигрышемъ.

Доходъ по билетамъ второго разряда уплачивается два раза въ годъ: 16 Июли и 16 Января по предъявленіи купоновъ въ Конторахъ и Отдѣленіяхъ Государственнаго Банка, Казначействахъ, а равно и въ Государственныхъ Сберегательныхъ Кассахъ.

Течение процентовъ по билетамъ настоящаго разряда начинается 16 Января 1918 года.

Тиражи выигрышей, происходящіе публично въ мѣстахъ, назначаемыхъ Министромъ Финансовъ, производятся для настоящаго разряда 16 Июля и 16 Января каждаго года.

Первый тиражъ выигрышей для второго разряда займа назначается на 16 Июля 1918 года.

Выплата выигрышей производится въ Конторахъ и Отдѣленіяхъ Государственнаго Банка спустя три мѣсяца послѣ тиража выигрышей, по предъявленіи билетоу со всеми купонами, срокъ оплаты коихъ наступилъ послѣ срока тиража, въ коемъ палъ выигрышъ на предъявляемый билетъ; стоимость недостающихъ купоновъ будетъ удержана изъ суммъ выигрыша.

Приносимый означеннымъ займомъ доходъ въ размѣрѣ 4½% въ годъ, а равно уплачиваемые по займу выигрыши, освобождаются навсегда отъ сбора съ доходовъ отъ денежныхъ капиталовъ.

Оплата выигрышей производится въ теченіе 30 лѣтъ со дня, назначеннаго для начала таковой уплаты, а купоновъ — въ теченіе 10 лѣтъ съ наступленія по нимъ сроковъ.

Билеты сего займа принимаются по цѣнамъ, устанавливаемымъ на каждое полугодіе Министромъ Финансовъ и публикуемымъ черезъ Правительствующій Сенатъ, въ залоги: а) по казеннымъ подрядамъ и поставкамъ, б) по обеспеченію Государственныхъ посыланій.

This Texas theme souvenir card depicts the vignettes from three United States postage stamps devoted to the Lone Star State's history.

To the left is shown a view of the Alamo, a symbol of Texans' heroic sacrifice in their fight for freedom of government, from the design of the 9¢ Ordinary issue of 1956; in the center is a reproduction of the portrait of Sam Houston, in bold stance, used for the 1964 Commemorative honoring that hero of Texas independence; on the right is the allegorical representation of the admission of Texas as the 28th State of the Union, from the 1945 Commemorative issued in connection with the centennial anniversary of Texas Statehood.

These engravings, especially prepared for this souvenir card, are simulations of the basic designs of the first United States postage stamps, issued in 1847. The full frames shown are a present-day conception extending the detail obliterated by the profusion of lettering and numerals appearing on the original stamps. The issue comprised a 5¢ stamp bearing a portrait of Franklin and a 10¢ stamp with a portrait of Washington.

This is the third instance where the Bureau has prepared reproductions of the stamps. The first occasion was in 1875 in connection with a Post Office Department project offering for sale specimens of all postage stamps issued under its auspices up to that time. The second reproduction involved the engraving and printing of the Centenary of United States Postage Stamps Souvenir Sheet issued by that Department in 1947.

These engravings are reproductions of the portraits from four postage stamps included in the Famous American Commemorative Series of 1940. Each is enclosed in the stylized frame for the respective category of which the particular stamp was a part. That series, acclaimed both for its subject diversification and beauty, brought to an end the long neglect of our Nation's cultural heritage as the subject of postage stamp designs.

The selections made for this card are the designs of the 10¢ denominations of the series' categories that were devoted to the arts. From left to right, the classifications depicted are music, literature, poetry, and painting.

Reproduced here are the vignettes from the three special United States airmail stamps issued in 1930 for exclusive use on the first European-Pan American round trip of the Graf Zeppelin. Each design, depicting in allegorical form the common theme of the airship in flight, is printed in the same color as the original stamp.

On the left is the vignette from the 65¢ denomination representing the Zeppelin's eastward journey over the Atlantic Ocean. That on the right is the representation of the airship's westward trip, from the \$2.60 stamp. The center design, from the \$1.30 stamp, shows the craft as a connecting link between the European and American Continents.

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Dedication to the principle of human rights for all mankind has been reflected in the design of several postage stamps of the United States. This is particularly true of the 1c Four Freedoms stamp issued in 1943 to impress upon the public the necessity for spreading the doctrine of those freedoms throughout the world.

The central design of the vignette, shown above in block form, consists of a bas-relief reproduction of Liberty holding the Torch of Freedom and Enlightenment. The wording, "Freedom of Speech and Religion, From Want and Fear," appears in a rectangular plaque below. This inscription also was included in the design of the 5c denomination of the Roosevelt Memorial series of stamps issued in 1945-1946 in tribute to President Franklin Delano Roosevelt.

Replicas of the six 4c "American Credo" stamps of 1960-1961 are arrayed to the left. The ideals by which our Nation has grown and prospered in freedom are expressed on those stamps in the brief and treasured words of noted men in history.

MEMORIAL TO THE WRIGHT BROTHERS
KIL DEVIL HILL
NORTH CAROLINA



The vignette shown in block form was originally used for the 6c airmail Wright Brothers commemorative stamp of 1949. First placed on sale December 17, 1949, at Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, the stamp was issued to commemorate the first flight of the Wright brothers.

In the upper right corner of the vignette appear likenesses of Wilbur and Orville Wright. The central motif of the stamp is a reproduction of the historic Wright brothers' plane.

On the left is an enlargement of an engraved vignette of the Wright Brothers National Memorial located atop Kill Devil Hill, North Carolina. Constructed of gray granite, the 60-foot high monument was completed in 1932. It stands at the site of the historic December 17, 1903 flight.
