#### 1934 ITALY - CYRENAICA & TRIPOLITANIA

January 29, 1934 pilots Lombardi and Mazzotti set out from ROME to initiate ITALIAN transAtlantic air mail service to SOUTH AMERICA. Covers from BENGASI (CYRENAICA) and
TRIPOLI (TRIPOLITANIA) were conveyed to ROME where a special postmark was applied.
The ITALIAN airplane, a Savoia Marchette S.71 flew from ROME - CASABLANCA THIES
(SENEGAL) - FERNANDO de NORONHA ISLANDS (off BRAZILIAN coast). The plane
went off course and crashed near FORTALEZA (on the BRAZILIAN coast). The pilots were
not seriously injured. Pan American Airways carried the mail into RIO DE JANEIRO and
BUENOS AIRES. Despit the crash mail arrived in BUENOS AIRES February 2<sup>nd</sup> - 4 days
after leaving ROME. The overprint on all three countries spelled AIRES as AYERS. There
was no time to print a special issue for the flight. All three countries overprinted copies of a
previous issue.

#### 1937 CANARY ISLANDS

Air mail service was suspended between LAS PALMAS – CANARY ISLANDS - MADRID and SEVILLE July 1936, the start of the Spanish Civil War. The chief postal administrator at LAS PALMAS was given permission to establish a provisional air mail service to SEVILLE with the GERMAN air line Lufthansa. To pay for this service a surcharge was introduced. The first mail left LAS PALMAS October 30, 1936. The service lasted until April 27, 1938.

Rate to MEXICO CITY was 40 ctmos air mail surcharge + letter rate of 13 ctmos for a total of 93 ctmos. This franking of 5x8c +1x40c + 13c surcharge or 93 ctmos is correct.



Both the INTERIOR & EXTERIOR sets were issued to commemorate the beginning of President Jorge Ubico's second term of office. At the time Pan American Airways were flying DC-2's in and out of the country.

Censored from city of GUATEMALA to CANAL ZONE June 8, 1944 by Servicio Nocturno. A special window at the Post Office was open until 11 or 12 p.m. From mid-1936 onwards full double postage, including tax stamps (2x1c). It is probable the PAN AM flight left early in the morning. This cover has the proper rate of 3c regular, 1c postal tax, air mail per 10gr 19c + 23c x 2 = 46c.



HAITI'S first air mail stamp was issued in 1929. Pilot J. Erroll Boyd was hired to fly mail from NEW YORK to HAITI along with co-pilot Robert G. Lyon. They left NEW YORK June 10, 1933. A storm forced them to make an emergency landing at ST. MARC, HAITI June 11<sup>th</sup>. The plane made PORT-au-PRINCE the next morning June 12<sup>th</sup>. The 8c U.S. air mail stamp paid for the NEW YORK – HAITI flight. The HAITIAN overprint was used on the return flight to WASHINGTON, D.C. July 6<sup>th</sup>. The mail was forwarded to NEW YORK by train. The cover is addressed to Columbia Flights, NEW YORK. That company was owned by pilot J.Erroll Boyd.



The aircraft flew from ENGLAND October 1927 arriving AUSTRALIA June 1928. They explored possible air routes in the EAST INDIES and South China Sea. They flew from PUERTO PRINCESA to MANILA then on to CABUGAO while enroute to HONG KONG.

The 25c "Black Lady" of the 1931 Monserrat Monastery issue was overprinted June 15, 1938. Foreign Currency was badly needed for the war effort and a large supply of this issue was available. To induce sales the five overprints and surcharges of the 25c "Black Lady" were in different colors. Spanish stamps were very popular worldwide. Internal air mail was non-existant during the Spanish Civil War. International air mail rates differed for most countries and was paid in addition to the international surface rate.

First flight TUNIS to LONDON June 2, 1936 by Air France in 12 hours. Franking 1.55fr. 1.25fr air mail via FRANCE plus 30c. TUNIS to England was 1.55 printed matter. Printed matter rates versus letter rates are confusing. At this time there is no information as to the air mail rate directly from TUNISIA to LONDON during this period in time. A recent study group has been formed re rates.

As shown above the aircraft overprint varies.
