Map of Louisiana Purchase

PLACED on sale April 30,1904 and withdrawn from sale on December 1, 1904. The stamps commemorate the centennial of the Louisianα Purchase and the designs picture the persons connected with the purchase and with the Exposition. Livingston, as minister to France, conducted the negotiations, Monroe as special ambassador to France in the matter of the purchase, President Jefferson during whose administration the purchase was made, and McKinley, who approved the acts of Congress connecting the government with the exposition.

ssued to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln. The design is from St. Gaudens' statue of Lincoln. The stamps were issued both perforate and imperforate, and on the experimental "bluish" paper.

Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition



ssued on June 1, 1909, in connection with the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition held in Seattle, Washington, in that year, to celebrate the purchase from Russia of the Alaska territory. William H. Seward was Secretary of State and negotiated the purchase.

F_{IBST} issued in late 1912 (officially January 1, 1913) the stamps served the dual purpose of commemorating the Panama Canal and, also, publicising the Panama-Pacific Exposition planned to be held in San Francisco in 1915. The original issue was perforated 12 and later, in 1915, appeared perforated 10. Original color of the 10c was an orange-yellow. Changed, officially, on August 25, 1913, to a darker shade known to philatelists as "orange".

Issued in connection with the unveiling of a statue erected, at Washington, D. C., in honor of John Ericsson, builder of the the Monitor, which engaged the Confederate vessel Merrimac during the Civil War.

Hawaii Sesqui-Centennial Hawaii, 1928





Issued in Hawaii, in connection with the Sesquicentennial celebration held August 15 to 20, 1928. First placed on sale August 13, 1928 at Honolulu and soon, thereafter, at other Hawaiian post offices. Never on sale at any post office (other than the Philatelic Agency) in continental United States.

To commemorate the 150th anniversary of the surrender of Fort Sackville near the present site of Vincennes, Ind. This stamp honors the great explorer who helped win the Northwest Territory to the American side. Ohio River Canalization

To commemorate the completion of the Ohio River canalization project between Cairo, Ill. and Pittsburgh, Pa. First placed on sale October 19, 1929.

Edison 1929









Edison's First Lamp.

To commemorate the 50th anniversary of the invention of the first incandescent electric lamp by Thomas Alva Edison. Was issued in flat plate, and rotary press sheets and in rotary press coils. First placed on sale (flat plate) on June 5, 1929 at Menlo Park, N. J. Rotary press printings in sheets and coils were issued June 11, 1929.

To commemorate the 300th anniversary of the founding of the Massachusetts Bay Colony by the Puritans who came to the New World to escape religious and political persecution.

Carolina-Charleston

1930



Colenial Governor and Indian To commemorate the 260th anniversary of the founding of the Province of Carolina and the 250th anniversary of the establishment of the original settlement near the site of the present city of Charleston. First placed on sale April 10, 1930.

General Von Steuben



Bust of General Von Steuben 689

To commemorate the 200th anniversary of the birth of General Von Steuben for his help to the Continental Army. A Prussian officer, he helped train the American soldiers.

Battle Of Braddock's Field

Statue of Colonel George Washington To commemorate the 175th anniversary of the Battle of Braddock's Field. The stamp shows George Washington in the uniform of a British officer while serving under General Braddock.
