## **OVERRUN COUNTRIES - 1943-1944**



CZECHOSLOVAKIA



For the first time since 1894 the United States Bureau of Engraving and Printing contracted with a private firm — the American Bank Note Company—to print the "Flag" series of stamps. This was done so that the stamps could be printed in the special multicolor process. Symbolic of this issue is the mythological bird, Phoenix, representing the renewal of life, which appears on the left side of each stamp. The kneeling figure at the right portrays the breaking of the shackles of appression.
