Buy GREEN COFFEE, have IT EXPERTLY ROASTED therby eliminating the LONG PROFITS and tremendous advertising and OTHER EXPENSES which you PAY REGULAR ROASTERS for marketing THEIR PRIVATE BRANDS.

I am prepared to sell you carefully selected green coffees, as quoted in enclosed circular letter, charge 1/2¢ per pound for roasting, shipping you the output (in original bags) which will, of course, be greater in bulk, but of less weight than the original lot of green coffee.

Roasted coffee can be shipped in barrels instead of bags at an extra charge of 50¢ for the barrel, and I recommend this plan as being preferable to shipping in bags.





No. R15 paid the Internal Revenue fees on this sight draft written in New Orleans, and payable to Señor Don José R. Marquette.

It was dated December 9, 1864.

The first adhesive revenue stamps issued by the federal government appeared during the early Civil War years. They exist because of the need for revenues to support the North's war effort. Virtually every document was required to carry a tax stamp, as were many proprietary articles such as matches, medicines, and perfumes. On July 1, 1862, Congress passed the Revenue Act of 1862, which included a broad program of additional taxes to offset the rising war expenditures and created the Office of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue.

The Commissioner advertised for bids for revenue stamps in August 1862, and the contract was awarded to Butler & Carpenter of Philadelphia.

Until December 25, 1862, the law stated that a stamp could be used only for payment of the tax upon the particular instrument or article specified on its face. After that date, they could be used indiscriminately except for the Proprietary stamps.

Most stamps of the first issue appeared in the latter part of 1862 or early in 1863. In the first issue, canceling usually was done with pen and ink.

# LOUISIANA POSTAL HISTORY

## The Regular Issue of 1861-66.

The 5¢ brown was issued in 1863; February 3, 1863 is the earliest documented use.  
(The above example was used at an unknown date in New Orleans.)

With the advent of the Civil War, the Post Office Department advised all postmasters to return stamps in their possession for credit. This necessitated a new issue of U. S. stamps. Although Toppan, Carpenter & Co. of Philadelphia attempted to renew their contract, the National Bank Note Co. of New York were the successful bidders, and the new set, with a complete change of design, was furnished by them. In early 1863 an order was issued declining to redeem old stamps any longer. (The stamps were being confiscated in territories through which the Confederate Army passed and adopted for use by the Confederate postal authorities.)



The vignette was taken from a drawing of a portrait bust by Jean Antoine Houdon, executed in 1785 from life. James Macdonough designed the stamp; Joseph Prosper Ourdan engraved the portrait. Cyrus Durand engraved the lathe border. William B. Nichols engraved the lettering and numerals.

The Commissioner of Internal Revenue advertised for bids for revenue stamps in August 1862 and the contract was awarded to Butler & Carpenter of Philadelphia. Numbers R1-R102 were used to pay taxes on documents and proprietary articles including playing cards. Until December 25, 1862, the law stated that a stamp could be used only for payment of the tax upon the particular instrument or article specified on its face. After that date, stamps, except the Proprietary, could be used indiscriminately.

# CREDIT MEMORANDUM.



## LOUISIANA PAPER COLLECTIBLES

The Louisiana Lottery  
Obverse of ticket purchased May 2, 1890 in New Orleans.

In 1868, the Legislature granted a charter to an institution that became famous as one of the most successful gambling schemes in American history—the Louisiana State Lottery Company. In return for an annual contribution of forty thousand dollars for the support of the Charity Hospital in New Orleans, and whatever private disbursements were necessary to maintain its political influence, the company was granted a monopoly of the lottery business for 25 years.




Subsequent charters extended this period, and also gave the company a monopoly of the policy game. The company was extraordinarily prosperous. At one time, when the question of renewing the charter was being debated, the company was able to offer the state an annual payment of \$1,250,000. By dint of expert lobbying, and the lavish expenditure of money, the Lottery Company acquired tremendous political power and, despite strenuous and well-organized opposition, maintained its existence until 1907.

The Louisiana Lottery  
Reverse of ticket purchased May 2, 1890 in New Orleans.


The Lottery began with the issuance of 25c tickets and a prize of \$3,750.

At the height of its fame and prosperity, when tickets were sold all over the United States, drawings were held daily, semi-monthly, and semi-annually, with a grand prize awarded semi-annually on a \$40 ticket of \$600,000. There was a \$15,000 prize on a \$1 ticket. The yearly total of the daily drawings was \$20,000,000, and of the others about \$28,000,000.



There is no record of a single person winning the grand prize, but a New Orleans barber once won the prize of \$300,000 on a whole \$20 ticket, and was promptly paid. A winning ticket was as good as a certified check and was cashed anywhere by banks. The company gained the confidence of the whole nation by having its drawings supervised by Generals P. G. T. Beauregard and Jubal A. Early of the Confederacy, who were each paid \$30,000 a year for about two days work a month. The company was finally put out of business by the national government in 1907 under laws passed in 1895 by Congress.

Tobacco Silk

“Tobacco silks” were given as a premium by various tobacco companies with the purchase of their products. They were in vogue from the late 1800s to the early 1900s.

They came in various themes: World leaders, flags, actresses, athletes, bathing beauties, butterflies, flowers and fruits just to name a few. Sizes vary depending on series, but the colors were vibrant. Presumably they were meant to appease the “little woman.”

The above, from “Turkey Red” tobacco, depicts the Mayoralty of New Orleans seal and was distributed by “Factory No. 7, 3<sup>rd</sup> District State NY.”







Bank of America sight draft in the amount of \$751.86 dated March 7, 1867 in New Orleans. Franked with Scott R6 (Bank Check, 2¢ Washington, orange) from the first U.S. Revenue Issue. Revenue stamp printed by Butler & Carpenter of Philadelphia.

The draft was printed by P. Durel & Co. 37 *Chartres* St. (It is interesting to note that the printer misspelled the name of the street on which his business was located. Chartres Street is a prominent thoroughfare in the *Vieux Carré*, named after the Duke of Chartres who later became the Duke of Orleans.)



Bank of America draft in the amount of \$750.00 dated September 27, 1867 in New Orleans. Franked with Scott R15 (U.S. Inter. Rev.) from the Revenue Issue of 1862-71.

This draft was also printed by Paulin Durel & Co. 37 *Chartres* St., New Orleans.  
(The printer got the name of the street right this time.)

## LOUISIANA POSTAL HISTORY



### The Issue of 1861

Scott 65, 3¢ Washington (rose).  
Printed by the National Bank Note Company.

Posted in New Orleans on May 11, 1865. Two days later, a meeting of the governors of Louisiana, Texas, Arkansas and Missouri advised General Kirby Smith to accept peace terms as follows: ". . . that the Confederate forces in the Trans-Mississippi Department be disbanded, and that officers and men return to their homes, freed from all disabilities and restored to the rights of citizenship; that guarantees be given that no officer, soldier, or citizen should be prosecuted in any court for offenses committed against the United States during the war that permission be granted to all persons to leave the department, with their arms and effects, unmolested, and go to any foreign country; that existing state governments be recognized until conventions could be called to settle all conflicts between the people of the states; that all military authority be surrendered to the several states; and that each state should retain . . . men to preserve order and protect life and property."



The Commissioner of Internal Revenue advertised for bids for revenue stamps in August 1862, and the contract was awarded to Butler & Carpenter of Philadelphia. Nos. R1-R102 were used to pay taxes on documents and property articles including playing cards.

Until December 25, 1862, the law stated that a stamp could be used only for payment of the tax upon the particular instrument or article specified on its face. After that date, stamps, except for the Proprietary, could be used indiscriminately.

Most stamps of the first issue appeared in the latter part of 1862 or early in 1863. In the first issue, canceling usually was done with pen and ink. Some of the stamps were in use eight years and were printed several times. Many color variations occurred, particularly if unstable pigments were used and the color was intended to be purple or violet.

Revenue stamped paper was authorized by Act of Congress of July 1, 1862. They became effective October 1, 1862, although regular delivery did not begin until July 1, 1865. The Bureau of Internal Revenue loaned the dies to private firms, with printing under the supervision of government representatives.
