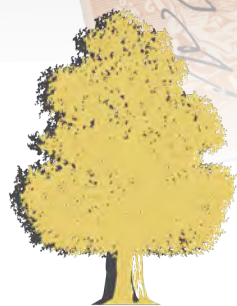

It was crusader Dorothea Dix who petitioned states to move funding from prisons such as these and assist the mentally ill in better facilities. Often times criminals and mentally ill were crammed in inhumane facilities during the mid to late 1800's.

- 50  **1866, cover from Maine to Argentina**, via New York and London, with lovely 3-color franking to make the 45¢ rate; some cover tears, Fine, a rare destination in this period, the 30¢ is especially scarce used anywhere except to Europe. Estimate \$200 - 300




- 51  **1866, cover from Vermont to England**, redirected within England, with 5 British backstamps. An attractive 3-color franking and an unusual way of making the 24¢ rate, Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$150 - 200




- 54  **1870's-80's, 13 covers to England**, all with with Banknote stamps, Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$150 - 200




- 52  **1868-95, 5 covers to Canada**, variety of frankings, all imaged on the website, Fine or better. Estimate \$75 - 100



- 55  **c. 1870, cover from Massachusetts to Turkey**, franked with 15¢ Bank Note (152 - catalogs \$350 on cover), the cover traveled via North German Union Mail (which only existed 1868-1871), backstamped German Postal Agency in Constantinople. The lot also contains a 1903 cover from Philadelphia to Constantinople at the regular 5¢ UPU rate, Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$150 - 200

- 76  **1907, cover from New York to Rome, Italy, forwarded and returned**, with Italian postage dues on front and 3 US postage dues on the reverse. The cover spent nearly a year in transit! Well traveled, to say the least, Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$75 - 100




- 75  **1902, cover from Nyack NY to Italy, forwarded to Switzerland**, via Southampton, with New York, Florence and Swiss backstamps, Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$40 - 60

These small photographs were patented in Paris by photographer André Adolphe Eugène Disdéri in 1854, although first used by Louis Dodero. They were usually made of an albumen print, which was a thin paper photograph mounted on a thicker paper card. The size of a carte de visite is 54.0 mm (2.125 in) 89 mm (3.5 in) mounted on a card sized 64 mm (2.5 in) 100 mm (4 in). In 1854, Disdéri had also patented a method of taking eight separate negatives on a single plate, which reduced production costs. The carte de visite was slow to gain widespread use until 1859, when Disdéri published Emperor Napoleon III's photos in this format. This made the format an overnight success. The new invention was so popular it was known as "cardomania" and it spread throughout Europe and then quickly to America and the rest of the world.

Each photograph was the size of a visiting card, and such photograph cards were traded among friends and visitors. Albums for the collection and display of cards became a common fixture in Victorian parlors. The immense popularity of these card photographs led to the publication and collection of photographs of prominent persons.
