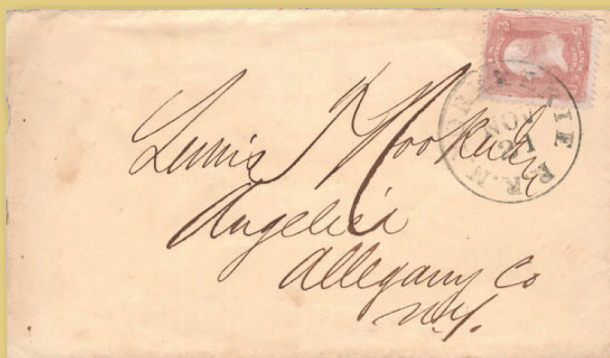

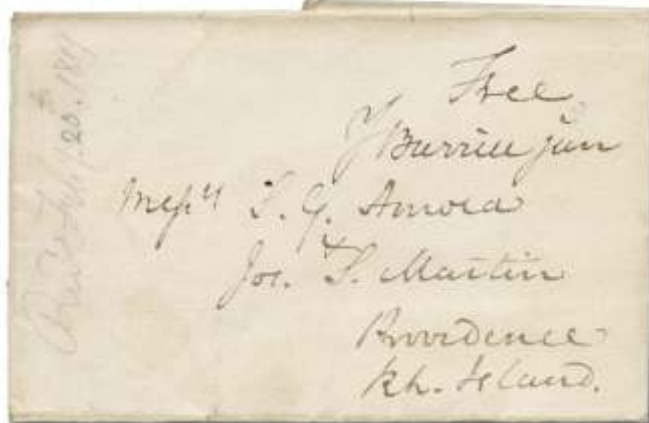
State Postmarks, Territorial and Western Express Covers




- 1  **[California] Los Angeles (Scott 65)**, 3¢ rose tied by 34 mm MAY 24 c.d.s. to Philadelphia, PA; the second type of c.d.s. from Los Angeles with period of use from 28 Sept 1856 to 9 Sept 1864; the 3¢ first class letter rate went into effect July 1, 1863, indicating this cover was mailed on May 25, 1864; roughly opened at right, Fine overall, rarity rating "4" - very scarce.

Estimate \$50 - 75

See Williams, John H. "California Town Postmarks 1849-1935" Vol I; the population of Los Angeles in the 1870 Census was only 5,278!



- 2  **[Rhode Island] 1807-19, 3 early stampless folded letters to Providence, R.I.**, including: 1807, Alexandria, Va. to Providence, R.I., including: 1807, Alexandria, Va. to Providence, R.I., ALEXA VA / SEP 25 postmark in red brown, with "20" rate mark, on stampless folded letter sheet; 1813, Lexington, Ky. to Providence, R.I., stampless folded letter sheet with "25" rate mark, KENTUCKY is upside down; and 1819, Washington City to Providence, R.I., marked Free / J. Burill (U.S. Senator), a Fine group. Estimate \$100 - 150



- 3 [Utah Territory] Salt Lake City, a neat drop rate cover franked with 1869, 1¢ Franklin (112), Fine to Very Fine. Scott \$260 ++. Estimate \$300 - 400



- 5 Greenhood & Newbauer Northern Express, black frank on a 3¢ Nesbitt entire (U26) from Weaverville, Cal. to San Francisco, probably ca. 1862-63, Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$75 - 100




- 4 Territorial covers, 1869-1902, 3 covers ie all; one mailed from Bingham Canyon, Utah Territory to Halifax, Nova Scotia Canada; one from Denmark to the Dakota Territory including contents; Official Dept of the Interior, returned to writer from the Oklahoma Territory; a lovely trio. Estimate \$75 - 100

- 6 Wells Fargo group, ca. 1855-80, 5 covers, all with black franks, mostly to San Francisco, one San Francisco to Philadelphia, and one having 5 covers used as a paste-up (unusual), Fine to Very Fine group. Estimate \$100 - 150

13  **New York Railroad (Towle 114-B-2)**, folded letter with manuscript 18 3/4 rate and solid red strike of straight line postmark, Fine to Very Fine, *Rarity VIII*. Estimate \$200 - 300




16  **Troy & Whitehall R.R. (Towle 100-A-1)**, blue c.d.s. ties #11 to blue folded letter with an illegal reuse of stamp on piece of another envelope, Very Fine, *Rarity VI*. Estimate \$75 - 100




14  **Pennsylvania RR, Winterville PA** 1889 postmark on a 1¢ Jefferson post card (UX9), addressed to Westmoreland, PA, Fine to Very Fine, a scarce cancel. Estimate \$50 - 75



17  **Vermont & Massachusetts R.R. (Towle 51-A-1)**, gorgeous Jan 30 c.d.s., Fine to Very Fine, *Rarity VI*. Estimate \$75 - 100



- 18  **Washington R.R. (239-X-1)**, beautifully struck cancels in blue on a stampless cover, Very Fine, *Rarity VII*. Estimate \$150 - 200




- 21  **Worcester & Nashua R.R. (Towle 21-A-1)**, readable postmark on a c. 1852 cr, Very Fine, *Rarity VII*. Estimate \$150 - 200




- 19  **Washington R.R. (Towle 239-N-1)**, eye-catching "all in blue" folded letter, Very Fine, *Rarity VII*. Estimate \$150 - 200



- 20  **Washington R.R. (Towle 239-N-1)**, circa 1849 cover doubly struck in blue with numeral 5, Fine to Very Fine, *Rarity VII*. Estimate \$150 - 200

Dickinson & Co.), with Boston and SHIP postmarks, "22" rate mark; 1840, St. Petersburg Russia to Germantown, Pa., with New York transit cancel, an interesting diplomatic pouch letter; 1840, French Foreign Ministry to the US Chargé d'Affaires in St. Petersburg Russia, a diplomatic pouch cover, with red seal on the reverse; 1851, London England to Philadelphia, marked "per Africa", with New York receiver; 1851, Paris France to New York, marked "per Africa via Liverpool", with detailed 4 page letter included; and 1866, New York to Havre France, marked "per Asia", with "16" (decimes) French due mark, lengthy letter enclosed (en français, naturellement), Fine to Very Fine. - 33  **Foreign Mail, incoming and outgoing group, 1894-1920**, 11 covers and postcards mainly to interesting destinations from the U.S., with one incoming from Winnipeg Canada canceled by oval "Branch Dead Letter", other destinations include Cape of Good Hope, Denmark, England, India, Japan, New South Wales, Portugal, Russian Poland and Yugoslavia. Nice items retailing \$50 to \$300 each, around \$1300 retail total, generally Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$400 - 600

- 34 **[Home Products] Varnishes**, lovely multicolor design on a clean and neat 1904 cover, Very Fine. Estimate \$50 - 75



- 35 **[Hotel] Ebbitt House, Army & Navy, Washington, D.C.**, lovely illustration on a cover franked with 2¢ (279B) tied by a Collection & Distribution Wagon cancel; the "White Wagon" mail program was set in motion on October 1, 1896 and its purposed was to keep the mail moving in New York city and Washington D.C. as both cities were exploding with new development to accommodate the ever expanding influx of people to these cities; the wagons were designed to pick u and deliver mail as they moved the streets; however, due to several reasons the service ended in 1900 just fours years later; this is a lovely example of mail which was processed on a white wagon! tears on the left side not affecting the cancels, Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$40 - 60



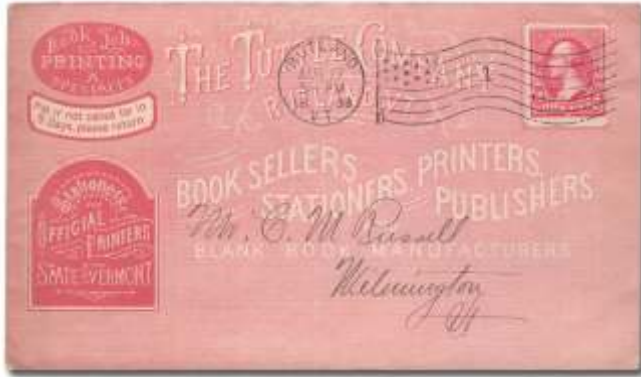
- 36 **[Machinery] Bird's Patent Coal Elevator**, interesting design on a 1¢ Bank Note drop rate cover from New Jersey, Fine to Very Fine, anyone need their coal elevated? Estimate \$40 - 60



- 37 **[Manufacturer] Auburn Paper Bag Manufg. Co.**, with 1863, 2¢ black (71) tied by a beautifully struck town cancel and a light struck black grid cancel allowing the design to show through; a lovely advertising cover, Very Fine. Scott \$75. Estimate \$60 - 80



- 38 **[Medical] B.B. & J. Haggerty, Druggists Glassware**, superb green advertising cameo on a lovely 1862 cover, with New York duplex cancel tying a 3¢ rose (65), Very Fine, great eye appeal. Estimate \$60 - 80



- 39 [Printing & Publishing] The Tuttle Company, Booksellers, Stationers, Printers, Publishers, gorgeous all over advertising cover franked with 2¢ (279Bg) fitted neatly in its “stamp collar” and tied by a perfect machine cancel of the waving flag; frame lines bordering all 4 margins are visible on this; great eye appeal that just doesn’t get any better! Very Fine. Estimate \$40 - 60



- 41 [Science] American Association for the Advancement of Science, a nice 1874 cover franked with 3¢ Bank Note (158), addressed to William S. Vaux / Philadelphia, PA with a nice “Due 3” in a circle; a great cover from one scientist to another, Fine to Very Fine, Putnam was one of the earliest anthropologists in the US and Vaux a notable mineralogist. Estimate \$40 - 60



- 40 [Publication] Scientific American, lovely all over illustrated advertisement on cover from New York; interesting fact is the “Scientific American” is still publishing magazines today, Very Fine to Extremely Fine. Estimate \$75 - 100

- 42 [Tobacco] Cigar and Wine, 5 lovely covers, one with an interesting blue cigar label (going to Germany), also an interesting stamp collar; all imaged on our website, generally Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$100 - 150




- 43  [Wagons] Parsons "Low-Down" Wagon Co, lovely design on a c. 1890 cover, Very Fine. Estimate \$50 - 75

- 46 Advertising covers, neat small group, 1896-1914, 6 in total featuring photography, expositions, tourism and jewelry, Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$30 - 40

- 47 1893 Columbian Exposition, Goldsmith postal cards, EX18 (World's Fair station cancel), EX23 (Mrs. Potter Palmer with/ name), EX46 Fine Arts Building, each postally used. Estimate \$75 - 100




- 50  **[Geometric] Honeycomb (Birdsborough, PA)**, a superb fancy cancel strike ties a fresh looking 2¢ Banknote (210) to this intra-state cover which also has a neatly struck c.d.s.; a gorgeous cover that looks like it was mailed yesterday rather than nearly 150 years ago, Very Fine. Estimate \$50 - 75




- 51  **[Geometric] Rosette (Alexandria, Va.)**, ties 3¢ rose (65) to cover along with matching town cancel, both postmarks are near complete and the fancy shows good detail as one would normally see in an early strike carved in cork, a little gem! Very Fine to Extremely Fine. Estimate \$75 - 100





- 52  **[Geometric] "Stove Pipe" (Leominster, Ma.)**, blue fancy cancel ties a 3¢ rose (65), with matching c.d.s. at left, both of which are very nice strikes; a lovely "C" monogram is on the back flap, Very Fine to Extremely Fine. Estimate \$60 - 80




- 53  **Star (Paper Mill Village, N.H.)**, a socked-on-the-nose cancel ties 3¢ rose (65) on a lovely cover, with matching beautifully designed town cancel at left; tastefully done corner ad rounds off the nice composition of this lovely piece with contents, Very Fine. Scott \$60. Estimate \$40 - 60




54  **[Waterbury] Four Hearts (Rohloff J-7)**, lovely bold strike on a neat folded advertiser cover (c. 1879) for gentlemen's hat, Very Fine, *Rohloff rarity RR*. Estimate \$75 - 100

56  **Fancy cancels, 1861-98**, 35 covers featuring unique fancy cancels on each, including stars, geometrics, rosettes, crosses and letters, most beautifully struck; all imaged on our website. Estimate \$300 - 400




55  **Waterbury fancy cancel group of postcards and covers, 1876-1880**, two covers and twelve postcards, mostly UX5 but a few UX7 all with lovely strikes of various Waterbury, CT cancels, many listed in Rohloff and rarity rated, a neat group for the specialist, Very Fine.

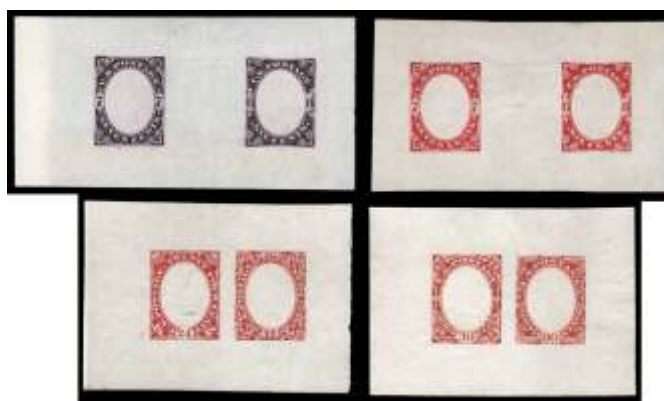

- 74 ★★ 1852, 1¢ blue, type IV (Scott 9), an interesting and very striking jumbo with parts of 2 neighboring stamps at the sides, design almost full at top but cutting at bottom, o.g., never hinged (very scarce thus!), Fine to Very Fine overall. Scott \$725 for hinged. Estimate \$250 - 350



- 75 ○ 1852, 1¢ blue, type IV (Scott 9), a premium example with large margins all around, showing type characteristics clearly, faint town cancel, Very Fine to Extremely Fine. Scott \$95. Estimate \$75 - 100




- 76 ✉ 1851, 3¢ orange brown, type II (Scott 10A), a lovely example tied to an 1851 folded letter by a complete rounded black grid paired with a red New Orleans c.d.s.; the ink shows through the exterior page of the folded letter meaning that the exterior page was used to write the letter, Very Fine to Extremely Fine, a rare 3¢ circular rate for 1,000-1,500 miles. Scott \$1,000+. Estimate \$600 - 800




- 77 ★★ 1852, 3¢ dull red, type I (Scott 11), margins all around, o.g., never hinged; very light purple handstamped "38" on reverse, Fine to Very Fine. Scott \$250 as hinged. Estimate \$150 - 200



- 78  **1852, 3¢ dull red, type II, “Gents” instead of “Cents” (Scott 11A var.),** position 66R2L, catalogs \$55 as used off cover - not priced on cover where it is much scarcer.
Estimate \$75 - 100



- 79  **1852, 3¢ dull red, type II (Scott 11A),** red Yazoo City MI c.d.s., addressed to New Orleans with green New Orleans “snow shovel” and “CAR.2” postmarks, Fine to Very Fine.

- 80 ○ **1855, 10¢ green, type III (Scott 15),** 3 large margins, blue cancel, about Fine. Scott \$150.

- 83 ○ **1851, 12¢ gray black (Scott 17),** intense impression with ample to large margins all around including sheet margin at bottom, unobtrusive black c.d.s., Very Fine. Scott \$250.

- 84 ★ 1851, 12¢ black, double transfer (Scott 17 var.), position 27R1, ample margins almost all around, o.g., hinged, Fine, *scarce with o.g.* Scott \$6,500. Estimate \$750 - 1,000

According to Neinken, the most pronounced shift on the entire plate. All rosettes with doubling, shifted portion of bottom right corner.

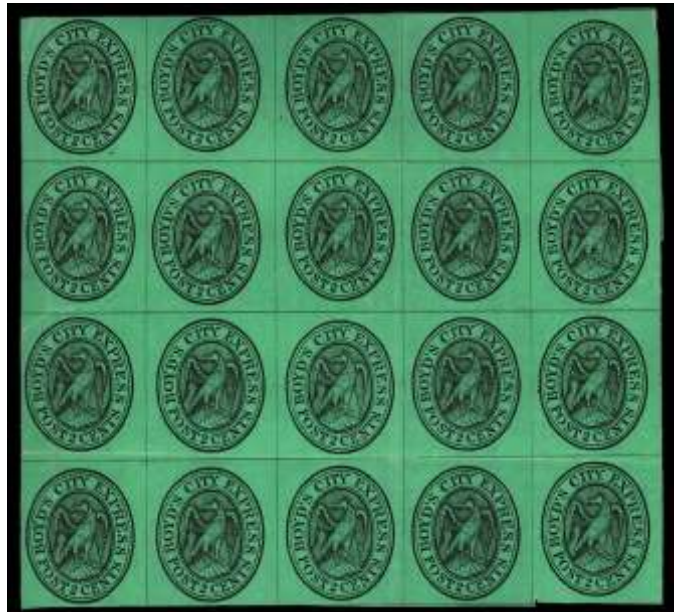

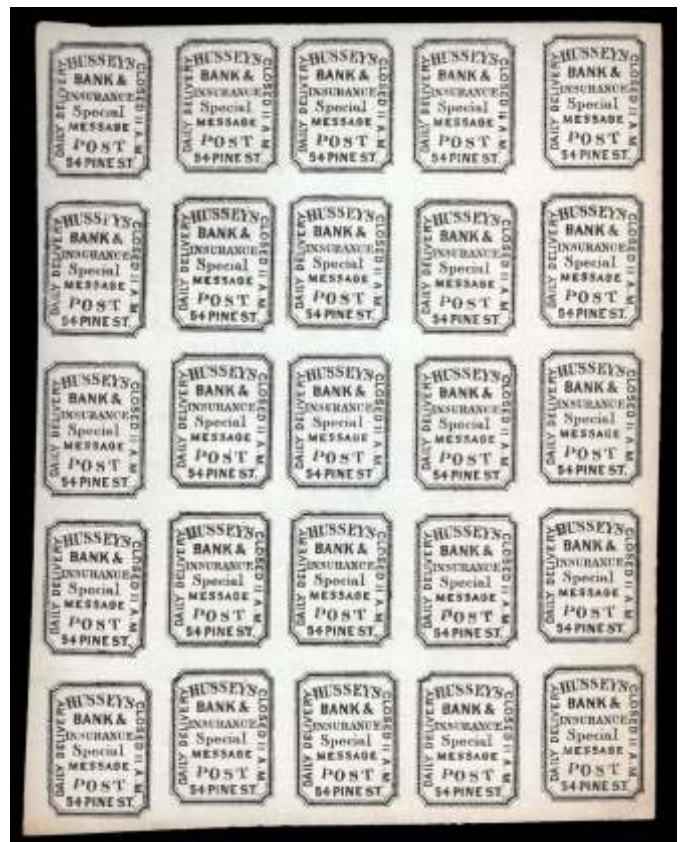

This post was established on January 15, 1847 by Aron Swarts, who had been employed at the U.S. Post Office at 6 Chatham Square. The U.S. branch closed and Swarts opened the next day in the same building. He called his service at "Branch Post Office." In early 1849, Swarts acquired the Bouton's City Dispatch Post. In about March 1856 Swarts sold this business to Benjamin Lockwood.

The postmarks of Swarts' Post Office are often found on stampless covers, as this post carried large quantities of mail without using adhesive stamps.
