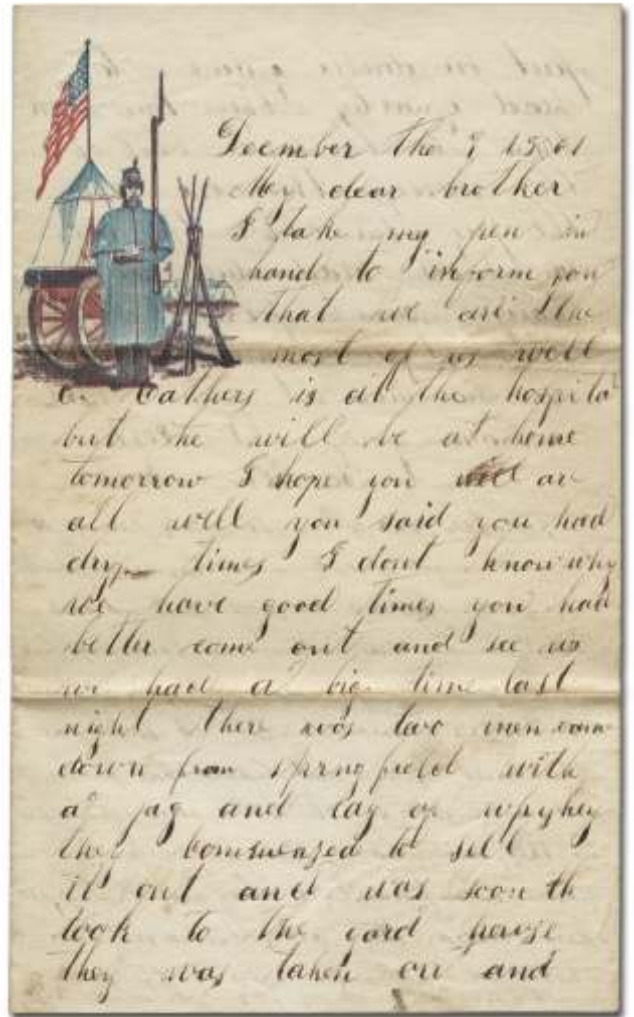

Cover roughly opened at right (looks like the Confederates got a piece of the 3¢ stamp), Fine letter, V.G. cover. Estimate \$75 - 100

- 72  **1863, soldier's letter from a "Camp Near Warrington, Va."**, a lengthy letter explaining what the soldier did during the day, in a cover addressed to the soldier's wife and neatly postmarked Washington, D.C. Roughly opened at left, Fine, nice historic content. Estimate \$120 - 150

- 70  **1861-68, 8 different Civil War related letters or covers, mostly with content**, with interesting tales of the war. Note one with patriotic letterhead, another from the Assistant Quartermaster's Office, generally Fine to Very Fine. Estimate \$150 - 200



- 71  **1862-64, soldier's mail**, including a cover (with historic content) to a colonel serving with the 37th Illinois Regiment in Louisiana, and two covers from a soldier in Camp Randall, Wis., Fine to Very Fine overall. Estimate \$75 - 100



- 73  **1863, soldier's letter from "Camp Relief", Washington, D.C.**, a lengthy letter written shortly after Grant took Vicksburg and with notes of the battle in the letter. *Tin Can Mail originated in the Niufo'ou island of Tonga whereby isalnders would use native mulberry poles that were buoyant to assist them in swimming to passing ships holding the mail wrapped in oilcloth and tied onto these spears. The packet was tied to the line and hauled up to the ship and placed in the mailstream at the next port of call. The purser on the ship would place incoming mail to the islands into an empty kerosene or cracker can and toss it overboard for the swimmers to retrieve. Around 1920 a German trader named Walter George Quesell, who worked for Burns Philp and Co., began rubber-stamping his outgoing mail with the mesage "Tin Can Mail". It didn't take long for stamp collectors and tourists to catch on and it became a phenomenon to witness. One fateful day in 1931 or 1932, one of the swimmers was bitten by a shark. The wound was fatal, and, as a result, the Tongan government decreed that swimming for the mail was prohibited. Thereafter, the mail could only be taken to and from ships in outrigger canoes. This, too, was hazardous because of the turgid waters that surround the island of Niufo'ou (Tin Can Island). But thereafter, the mail was marked "Tin Can-Canoe Mail." It was still a novelty, eagerly sought by stamp collectors all over the world.*
