# **Autographs**



1 Barton, Clara, Union Army nurse during the Civil War, and founder of the American Red Cross in 1881. Autograph on full document dated July 13, 1865, headed "Office of Correspondence with the friends of the Missing Men of the United States Army". Some age spots, otherwise Fine. Her signature is scarce and much sought after. Estimate \$400 - 600

The first Great Oklahoma Balloon Race & Airshow was a celebration of the 200th, year of man's flight. In this, our second eciebration of flight, we honor a true Oklahoma hero, LL General Thomas P. Stafford. General Stafford is a graduate of the Naval Academy, served in the Air Force as a Test Flot, and as one of our most honored Astronauts whose space achievements have earned him the sespect and admiration of peoples throughout the world.

General Stafford has 8 flown 110 different types of aircraft, logging 7,400 flight hours. S21 of these hours have been in Space. His achievements include serving as pilot for Gentin VI, Commander of Germial IX, backsp Commander of Apollo-Sount Test Project. He is one of three people to have flown in four different types of spacecraft and he was the first to achieve a rendervous in Space.

General Stafford has been awarded two NASA DSM's, two NASA Exceptional Services Medals, the ISC Commendation, the USAF Command Flot Astronaut Wings, the USAF DSM v/S OLC, the USAF DPC, the Chantes Flight Award, VFW National Space Award, General White Truphy, FAI Space Medals, the Hatmon Trophy, and the Lus Angeles C of C Kary Hawk Sounds the Time Awards, the also received the Doulette Awards and the NASA Medal for Outstanding Leudership.

Tom Stafford, who has been most active in the development of the Air Space Messeum, is a Trustee and a Member of the Oklahoma Air Space Messeum, is a Trustee and a Member of the Oklahoma Hall of Fame.

Joining us to hone General Scafford in Eugene A. Cernan, Captain, USN (Rel.) who flew with Commander Stafford on Apollo Xa, and served as Senior U.S. Negotiator with the USR for the Apollo-Soyuz Mission.




First Ladies of the United States, Five covers featuring First Lady of the United States, Edith K. Roosevelt (1861-1948); wife of Autograph Theodore Roosevelt. Envelope Franked "Free / Edith K Roosevelt" and addressed in her hand to the E. A. Keach Co in Danielson, CT. Postmarked Oyster Bay, NY, 1936. Postal cancellation over signature; First Lady of the United States, Grace Coolidge (1879-1957); wife of Calvin Coolidge. Typed Envelope Franked "Grace Coolidge," Northampton, MA, 1955. Cancellation over signature. Some foxing; First Lady of the United States, Lucretia Garfield (1832-1918); wife of James A Garfield. Mourning Cover Franked "Lucretia R. Garfield," Washington, DC. Address in another hand. Date stamp touches signature. Mrs. Garfield's care for her husband as he slowly died from complications after being shot by a crazed office-seeker earned the nation's sympathy, and when she was widowed, she mourned for years; First Lady of the United States, Frances Cleveland (1864-1947); second wife of President Grover Cleveland, she was many years his junior; noted for her beauty and bright personality. Franked Cover Signed "Frances F Cleveland Preston," Princeton, NJ, 3/27/1934, addressed in another hand to Willard L Dutton of Brooklyn, NY. Cancellation across signature, otherwise in fine condition; acting First Lady of the United States, Mary Lord Harrison (1858-1948); second wife of President Benjamin Harrison; though she married Harrison after his time as President, she had moved into the White House to assist his first wife - her aunt - when she became ill. Autograph Cover Franked "Mary Lord Harrison" NYC, 10/18/1946, and addressed in her hand to Frances Beebe, secretary of Elmira College; alwso included is typewritten letter signed by Luci Johnson (daughter of Lyndon B. Johnson); a lovely group of FLOTUS memorabilia.



Just days after the death of George Dewey, hero of Manila Bay, on January 17, Wood writes to his widow, "I cannot tell you how shocked and aggrieved I was to hear of his illness and its unfortunate termination...I valued his friendship and good opinion very highly...The nation has lost one of its great figures in both the Navy and Army..." Henry Cabot Lodge, Republican U.S. senator for more than 31 years (1893-1924) and chairman of the Committee on Foreign Relations; he led the successful congressional opposition to the country's participation in the League of Nations following World War I, Lodge's own efforts in the Senate ensured that the United States could not join the League, undermining its effectiveness and legitimacy. Great content Typewritten Letter Signed "H.C. Lodge" as Senator from MA and Chair of the Committee on Foreign Relations, on committee stationery, Washington, 10/20/1919, he tells a constituent that the newly formed League of Nations "in its present form is full of serious dangers, not only to the cause of peace, but to the rights and interests of the American people..." Folds, otherwise choice. With original envelope bearing printed frank postmarked Oct 24, 1919.

Andrew William Mellon, sometimes A.W., was an American banker, businessman, industrialist, philanthropist, art collector, and politician from the wealthy Mellon family of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, he established a vast business empire before transitioning into politics where he served as United States Secretary of the Treasury from March 9, 1921, to February 12, 1932, presiding over the boom years of the 1920s and the Wall Street crash of 1929. Official signature on business-sized card, un-dated, measures 1¾ x 3¼ inches, Very Fine with accompanying letter dated February 6, 1930 from his secretary regarding this card.

Nelson Aldrich Rockefeller (July 8, 1908 - January 26, 1979) was an American businessman and politician who served as the 41st vice president of the United States from 1974 to 1977, and previously as the 49th governor of New York from 1959 to 1973. Signed typewritten letter dated June 16, 1965, Fine.

Fiorello Henry La Guardia was an American politician. He is best known for being the 99th Mayor of New York City for three terms from 1934 to 1945 as a pro-New Deal liberal progressive Republican, previously he had been elected to Congress in 1916 and 1918, and again from 1922 through 1930. Official signature on index-sized card, un-dated, measures 5 x 3½ inches, Very Fine with accompanying FDC postmarked Apr 24, 1972.

James Michael Curley (November 20, 1874 - No-

vember 12, 1958) was an American Democratic Party politician from Boston, Massachusetts, he was one of the most colorful figures in Massachusetts politics in the first half of the 20th century, he served four terms as Democratic Mayor of Boston, Massachusetts, including part of one while in prison. Typewritten signed letter dated September 28, 1921, Fine.

Thomas Edmund Dewey (March 24, 1902 - March 16, 1971) was an American lawyer, prosecutor, and politician. He served as the 47th governor of New York from 1943 to 1954. In 1944 and 1948, he was the Republican Party's nominee for president. Typewritten signed letter dated December 20, 1937, Fine. Estimate \$150 - 200

Beginning in Sept. 1945, 50,000 U.S. Marines were deployed to North China to assist Chiang Kai-shek's forces in disarming and repatriating the Japanese in China and in controlling port, railroads and airfields. This was in addition to the approximately 60,000 U.S. soldiers remaining in China at the end of the war. On Oct. 15, 1945 the U.S. Marine Corps accepted the surrender of more than 60,000 Japanese troops in Tientsin. The U.S. Marines remained in China for four years, finally departing in June 1949.

The certificates on this lot are a comedy, and do not reflect well on the expertising community. All 3 certificates are from 2021. The P.S.A.G. certificate indicates that the lot is genuine, and mentions no faults. The P.S.E. certificate mentions "a small repair and part of the design drawn in in the right foot of the right bear" - none of which are visible to us, even under strong magnification. The P.F. certificate mentions "a tiny thin spot at upper left and small filled thins at lower right" - none of which are visible in fluid, and which does not match what P.S.E. reported. Go figure. At any rate, all 3 concur at least that the stamp is genuine.

This post was established on January 15, 1847 by Aron Swarts, who had been employed at the U.S. Post Office at 6 Chatham Square. The U.S. branch closed and Swarts opened the next day in the same building. He called his service at "Branch Post Office." In early 1849, Swarts acquired the Bouton's City Dispatch Post. In about March 1856 Swarts sold this business to Benjamin Lockwood.

The postmarks of Swarts' Post Office are often found on stampless covers, as this post carried large quantities of mail without using adhesive stamps.


